1	United Nations Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC)	<p>In 2018, the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK), as the focal point for Indonesia in reviewing UNCAC, has conducted a number of coordination meetings with ministries/institutions to provide inputs to the Indonesia's executive summary document. This document contains the summary of all frameworks and institutional aspects as a review of UNCAC's implementation in Indonesia, including good practices, challenges, and the need for technical assistance. The Indonesia's Executive Summary Document has been completed and published on the official UNODC website. Review on the UNCAC round that has been ongoing since 2016 produced 21 recommendations, 14 of them regarding prevention, and 7 on asset recovery. KPK actively participated in routine meetings related to UNCAC:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A series of ninth session meetings of the Implementation Review Group (IRG) on June 4-6, 2018, in Vienna, Austria, which was continued with the twelfth session of Meeting of the Open Ended Intergovernmental Working Group on Asset Recovery on June 6-7, 2018. 2. A series of meetings for 1st Resumed 9th Session of IRG and the 9th Working Group on Prevention in Vienna, Australia, on September 3-7, 2018. 3. The ninth meeting for 2nd Resumed IRG in Vienna, Austria, on November 12-14, 2018. <p>KPK also actively participated in trilateral meetings in Vienna, Austria, in relation with Indonesia's role as a reviewing country:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Trilateral meeting between Indonesia, Honduras, Vietnam, and UNODC on June 7, 2018. 2. Trilateral meeting between Indonesia, Tanzania, South Sudan, and UNODC on November 14, 2018. <p>KPK with UNODC conducted Public Discussion to Present the Review Results of Round I and II of United Nations Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC) on November 27, 2018. This public discussion was aimed to review the follow up of the implementation of UNCAC in Indonesia, review Indonesia's compliance on UNCAC's articles, and follow up UNCAC's recommendations from the two rounds. This activity was supported by a number of resource persons, namely the Minister of Law and Human Rights, Head of Commission III of the House of Representatives, representative from the National Development Planning Agency (Bappenas), representative from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and representative from UNODC Regional Office for South East Asia and the Pasific (ROSEAP).</p>

2	G-20	<p>In the G-20 cooperation framework on anti-corruption, KPK promoted the implementation of Beneficial Ownership (BO) transparency in Indonesia through Disparity Analysis between Provisions of Beneficial Ownership for Corporations/Other Engagements in Indonesia and International Standards. KPK also actively played a role in developing the agreement of High-Level Principles for Preventing and Managing 'Conflict of Interest' in the Public Sector and High-Level Principles for Preventing Corruption and Ensuring Integrity in State-Owned Enterprises in the G-20 forum.</p> <p>KPK became a crucial part of Indonesian delegations at the G20 Anti-Corruption Working Group (ACWG) I in Buenos Aires, Argentina, on February 27 – March 1, 2018, and ACWG II in Paris, France, on June 25-30, 2018. In ACWG I and II, KPK sent its delegations to provide active contribution, particularly to strengthen the commitment of G20 countries in preventing and eradicating corruption. ACWG I meeting discussed about, among others, the annual work plan for Argentina's Presidency for G20 ACWG 2018, deciding on High Level Principles to be discussed in 2018, and the working methodology of ACWG. During this meeting, there was a side event called "Curtailling Corruption and Promoting Integrity in State-owned Enterprises."</p> <p>Some of the things conveyed by Indonesia in ACWG II meeting were inputs on the draft of High Level Principles and G20 ACWG Action Plan 2019-2021 documents upon alignment with the needs and national interest of Indonesia, and interventions and opinions on a number of critical issues, like on the Corruption and Gender issue, where Indonesian delegation presented KPK's achievements through its program "Female Anti-Corruption (SPAK)".</p>

3	APEC	<p>KPK's critical role related to APEC on 2018 was by actively contributing in the following APEC routine meetings: ✓ APEC Anti-Corruption and Transparency Experts Working Group (ACTWG) Meeting I on February 25 – 26, 2018 ✓ APEC Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group (ACTWG) and APEC Anti-Corruption Network (ACTNET) on August 5-7, 2018.</p> <p>Both of these meetings were held at Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea. In each of these meetings, Indonesian delegation presented their achievements on corruption prevention and eradication programs. ACTWG I meeting began with APEC Best Fit Practices and Experience Sharing Workshop on Corruption Prevention Mechanisms. In this meeting, KPK actively participated in the discussion on ACTWG Workplan 2018 and changes on ACTWG Multi-Year Strategic Plan 2013 – 2020.</p> <p>In the series of activities of ACTWG III at Papua New Guinea, KPK conveyed its best practices on handling corruption and money laundering crime, presented its review on the second round of UNCAC, and conveyed the follow up of the Jakarta Statement on Principles for Anti-Corruption Agencies (Jakarta Principles). KPK also actively engaged in the discussion on APEC agreements, both in ACWG and ACTNET.</p>
4	International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA)	<p>In 2018, KPK became a part of Indonesian delegation on the seventh meeting of Assembly of Parties (AoP) for International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA) in Vienna, Austria, on September 27-28, 2018. Indonesia was one of the founding members of IACA and was recorded as the 49th Country in the Agreement to Establish IACA. In this meeting, the Indonesian delegation conveyed Indonesia's view that anti-corruption education is a primary instrument in the efforts to prevent and eradicate corruption.</p> <p>KPK also held a bilateral meeting with IACA during the AoP meeting to discuss the possibilities of entering into a cooperation between KPK's Anti-Corruption Learning Center (ACLC) and IACA. This meeting discussed the cooperation potential in the form of tailor made training for KPK employees, and cooperation on the International Master in Anti-Corruption Studies (IMACS) program. The IMACS Program is the only master program in the world that studies anti-corruption issues in a holistic manner. In addition to that, KPK also conducted a visit to IACA's campus in Laxenburg, Austria.</p>

5	South East Asia Parties Against Corruption (SEA-PAC)	<p>KPK conveyed the initiative to conduct joint training with SEA-PAC members through the Concept Notes of Capacity Building Stocktaking Programme at the SEA-PAC Secretariat meeting in Manila, Phillipines, on July 2018. KPK spread questionnaire to SEA-PAC members to identify mutual issues faced by anti-corruption institutions in Southeast Asia. The answer to this questionnaire was then analyzed to be made as the theme in the joint training with SEA-PAC members.</p> <p>KPK also actively contributed in two SEA-PAC routine meetings, namely: ✓ The 14th SEA-PAC Secretariat Meeting held in Manila, Phillipines, on July 17-20, 2018. ✓ The 14th SEA-PAC Principals Meeting held in Singapore on October 29-31, 2018.</p> <p>On the Principals Meeting, parties agreed on the Terms of Reference for Cooperation of Parties to the Memorandum of Understanding of the SEA-PAC, as an implementation of the SEA-PAC MoU. In addition, the Capacity Building Stocktaking Programme report analysis by KPK was approved by all SEA-PAC members, and will be made as basis to decide the joint training theme in 2019.</p>
6	Open Government Partnership (OGP)	<p>The 5th Open Government partnership (OGP) was held on July 16-19, 2018 in Tbilisi, Georgia, where KPK was a part of Indonesian Delegation. The OGP Global Summit was attended by governments, parliaments, international organizations, and representatives from civil society. This meeting was held every two years, and was interspersed by regional meetings of each area. OGP is an international movement initiated by 8 (eight) countries, namely South Africa, United States of America, Brazil, Phillipines, Indonesia, England, Mexico and Norway on September 2011. Indonesia held an active role as the steering committee.</p> <p>The Head of KPK became a panelist in the “The challenges and successes of National Anti-Corruption Systems” session and presented KPK’s achievement and experience in eradicating corruption in Indonesia. On the corruption prevention theme, Indonesia conveyed an idea to implement the transparency of Beneficial Ownership, which was enshrined in Presidential Regulation No. 13 Year 2008 on Principles to Identify the Beneficial Owners of Corporations.</p>

7	International Anti-Corruption Conference (IACC) and International Corruption Hunters Alliance Network (ICHA)	<p>KPK was a part of Indonesian delegation on the 18th International Anti-Corruption Conference (IACC) and 4th Biennale Meeting of International Corruption Hunters Alliance Network (ICHA). IACC was held on October 22-24, 2018 and ICHA was held on October 25-26, 2018, both in Copenhagen, Denmark.</p> <p>18th International Anti-Corruption Conference (IACC) This was a summit meeting attended by ministers, leaders of international organizations, and private sectors, to discuss international collaboration strategy on anti-corruption. Participants conveyed concrete action plan and commitment for anti-corruption, and agreed on a joint statement to carry out global anti-corruption efforts. During this activity, the Head of KPK presented Indonesia’s achievement in eradicating corruption, including on future action plans for corruption eradication in Indonesia.</p> <p>There were more than 35 workshop sessions during IACC. KPK delegates became speakers in several sessions. During this meeting, KPK held a workshop on “New Impetus of Anti-Corruption Agencies: UNCAC, Jakarta Principles, and beyond”.</p> <p>4th Biennale Meeting of International Corruption Hunters Alliance Network (ICHA) The World Bank-International Corruption Hunters Alliance (ICHA) meeting was intended to promote strong cooperation between national authorities and international organizations in eradicating corruption. This event convened senior officials, heads of anti-corruption organizations, prosecutors, and other authorized parties from Africa, South America, Europe, and Asia. This meeting also aimed to provide opportunity for ICHA members to discuss important issues in the effort to eradicate corruption and promote stronger network among organizations. The Head of KPK gave a presentation on witness and victim protection mechanism in corruption cases in Indonesia on the “Encouraging Reporting through Whistleblower Systems and Protections” session.</p>
8	Global Expert Group Meeting (EGM) on Jakarta Principles	<p>KPK actively participated during the expert meeting to develop “Commentary on the Jakarta Statement on Principles for Anti-Corruption Agencies”, intended to discuss the objective of 16 principles in the Jakarta Principles.</p> <p>This meeting was a follow up from the COSP UNCAC 2017 meeting, where KPK collaborated with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to submit a proposal to grant a mandate to UNODC to develop the technical implementation guideline, Article 6 of UNCAC, on the 7/6 Resolution regarding Marrakech Declaration on the Prevention of Corruption. The Head of KPK played a critical role as moderator in the first session, “Setting the stage: Jakarta Principles in theory and practice”.</p>
